



Security Update to Businesses

In light of the up-and-coming PM Election on the 2nd of May 2024, the following advise is given to businesses after SICCI Board and RSIPF Operations meet on the 30th of April 2024.

PM Election Advice to Businesses

- Advice is Business as usual however, business houses must have a contingent plan should situation triggers RSIPF to impose a curfew and restriction of movement comes into effect.
- **Police Operation** is very aware of the 2021 riots that has impacted on business assurance is given that for the PM election, there will be high visibility of police throughout Honiara from Lungga to White River with police posts stationed in East, Central and West Honiara along the streets, at junctions and roundabouts.

 - ✓ **East:** legacy Multipurpose Hall, National Stadium and SINIS
 - ✓ **Central:** Kukum Traffic Centre, Central Market and Central Police Station
 - ✓ **West:** Rove HQ and White River Police Post

- Reason for the extension of the liquor ban, is because current assessment of the situation is of high risk and so to address this the ban was extended.
 - There is a possibility that the duration of the Liquor Ban may be reduced depending on the situation up till the Saturday, 4th May 2024. RSIPF will monitor and discuss with AG to revoke the ban if situation remains stable after Friday, 3rd May 2024.
